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# Chapter 05: Naming Guidelines for Video and Audio for the Web of Procedural Manual for UNICEF Division of Communication (DOC) Web With User Guidelines.

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## Section 1:

In-House Video and Audio Clips (produced at NYHQ, originating from video and audio material that have been indexed by broadcast and have been assigned a unique project number).

## <u>Video:</u>

For .rm files:

### [project number]I/h\_[clip sequence number][description].rm

where:

- [project number] is project number assigned to video project by broadcast (i.e. 4019 for Commercial Sexual Exploitation footage)
- I/h indicates if the clip is low (I) or high (h) bandwidth [NOTE: the lowercase I (L) may resemble the number 1 (one)]
- [clip sequence number] is the sequence number of a clip within one project (i.e. for project number 4019, the first high bandwidth clip that goes up will be named 4019h\_1[description].rm, the second clip that goes up will be named 4019h\_2[description].rm, etc.)
- [description] is a web clip title that will be assigned by broadcast along with a particular project number, with a maximum of 15 alphanumeric characters in length.

The filename must be in **lowercase**.

For clips that are in languages other than English:

#### [project number]I/h\_[clip sequence number][description]\_[language code].rm

where

[language code] is two letter language code (see table below)

_fr
_sp
_ru
_ch
_ar

For .ram files:

The filename must be in **lowercase**.

Naming for the **.ram file** will be the same as the **.rm file**. For example, if your .rm file is called **4019h\_1csec.rm** the name of your corresponding .ram file would be **4019h\_1csec.ram** 

#### Audio (mp3):

The filename must be **lowercase**.

If the file has a project number assigned by broadcast:

### [project number]\_[description].mp3

where

- [project number] is project number assigned to audio project by broadcast
- [description] is a web clip title that will be assigned by broadcast along with a particular project number, with a maximum of 15 alphanumeric characters in length

**<u>NOTE</u>**: If the file does not have an assigned project number, please follow guidelines under Section 2.

## Section 2:

Outside Video and Audio Clips *or* all clips without a project number at NYHQ (produced in the field or by outside partners, whereby there is no project number assigned through broadcast)

#### Video:

For .rm files:

#### [2-letter country code][last two digits of year produced in]l/h\_[description].ram

where:

- [2-letter country code] is unique code per country as defined by ISO on <u>http://www.iso.org/iso/en/prods-services/iso3166ma/02iso-3166-code-lists/list-en1.html</u>
- [last two digits of year produced in] is 04 for 2004
- I/h indicates if the clip is low (I) or high (h) bandwidth [NOTE: the lowercase I (L) may resemble the number 1 (one)]
- **[description]** is a meaningful, descriptive web clip title assigned by the clip's producer, with a maximum of 15 alphanumeric characters in length

<u>For example</u>, a final high bandwidth clip produced in Afghanistan on start of school in 2004 can be named as follows:

#### af04h\_schoolstart.rm

The filename must be in **lowercase**.

For clips that are in languages other than English:

#### [project number]I/h\_[clip sequence number][description]\_[language code].rm

where

[ianguage code] is two letter language code (see table below)

French	_fr
Spanish	_sp
Russian	_ru
Chinese	_ch
Arabic	_ar

#### For .ram files:

The filename must be in **lowercase**.

Naming for the **.ram file** will be the same as the **.rm file**. For example, if your .rm file is called **af04h\_schoolstart.rm** the name of your corresponding .ram file would be **af04h\_schoolstart.ram** 

#### Audio (mp3):

The file name must be lowercase.

The file name should follow the following formula:

#### [2-letter country code][last two digits of year produced in] \_[description].mp3

where:

- [2-letter country code] is unique code per country as defined by ISO on http://www.iso.org/iso/en/prods-services/iso3166ma/02iso-3166-code-lists/list-en1.html
- [last two digits of year produced in] is 04 for 2004
- **[description]** is a meaningful, descriptive web clip title assigned by the clip's producer, with a maximum of 15 alphanumeric characters in length

NOTE: Audio produced at NYHQ without a project number, should use this naming convention, with US as country code (i.e. **us04\_darfurclaycomb.mp3**)

#### For clips that are in languages other than English:

[project number]I/h\_[clip sequence number][description]\_[language code].rm

where

[language code] is two letter language code (see table below)

French	_fr
Spanish	_sp
Russian	_ru
Chinese	_ch
Arabic	_ar

Video in <u>Arabic</u> created at NYHQ on HIV/AIDS and young people (where the project number and description has been set by broadcast prior to production), <u>third</u> out of a sequence of 4 videos with the same project number and same description	Low Bandwidth: 4036l_3hivaidsyp_sp.rm High Bandwidth: 4036h_3hivaidsyp_sp.rm	Low Bandwidth: 4036l_3hivaidsyp_ar.ram High Bandwidth: 4036h_3hivaidsyp_ar.ram
Video in <u>English</u> created by UNICEF Afghanistan on HIV/AIDS and young people (where there is no project number registered in broadcast as this is an external video, and the description has been set by the producer – namely UNICEF Afghanistan)	Low Bandwidth: af04I_yphivaids.rm High Bandwidth: af04h_yphivaids.rm	Low Bandwidth: af04l_yphivaids.ram High Bandwidth: af04h_yphivaids.ram
Video in <u>French</u> created by UNICEF Rwanda on HIV/AIDS and young people (where there is no project number registered in broadcast as this is an external video, and the description has been set by the producer – namely UNICEF Rwanda)	Low Bandwidth: rw04l_yphivaids_fr.rm High Bandwidth: rw04h_yphivaids_fr.rm	Low Bandwidth: rw04l_yphivaids_fr.ram High Bandwidth: rw04h_yphivaids_fr.ram

2. <u>Audio</u> NOTE: these are sample project numbers and descriptions, and do not correspond to actual projects.

Description	.mp3 file name
Audio in <u>English</u> created at NYHQ on HIV/AIDS and young people (where the project number and description has been set by broadcast prior to production).	4036_hivaidsyp.mp3
Audio in <u>Chinese</u> created at NYHQ on HIV/AIDS and young people (where the project number and description has been set by broadcast prior to production).	4036_hivaidsyp_ch.mp3
Audio in <u>English</u> created by UNICEF Afghanistan on HIV/AIDS and young people (where there is no project number registered in broadcast as this is an external audio, and where the description has been set by the producer – namely UNICEF Afghanistan).	af04_youngpeoplehiv.mp3
Audio in <u>French</u> created by UNICEF Rwanda on HIV/AIDS and young people (where there is no project number registered in broadcast as this is an external audio, and the description has been set by the producer – namely UNICEF Rwanda). <i>NOTE: In this example, the description is also in French, although the preferred language for descriptions is English, regardless of the language the actual clip is in.</i>	rw04_jeunesetsida_fr.mp3
